



Constitution

Dyfed Dirt Bike Club, founded on 28 November 2003, has for its aims the encouragement and protection of off-road motorcycle interests in the Lampeter and District area. The Club endeavours to meet the requirements of both the competition and recreational rider and its non-rider members by organising various sporting, social and training events throughout the year and the development of youth riders.

Membership

Motorcyclists and enthusiasts wishing to join the Club should apply to any member with whom they are acquainted, directly to the Club Membership Secretary or via the ACU website. The annual membership fee will be £5. Annual Membership starts on the 1st of January each year, members who have not renewed their membership before the 1st of March will be deemed to have resigned from the club. This fee includes affiliations fee which entitles members to the various benefits attached thereto. The membership fee will be reviewed annually at the Annual General Meeting.

Rules

1. The Club shall be called Dyfed Dirt Bike Club (Clwb Beic Modur Dyfed) and shall have for its object the encouragement and protection of off-road motorcycle interests in this district.
2. The club is run as a non-profit Limited company.
3. All members are required to abide by the rules of the club and the Auto Cycle Union (ACU) where applicable.
4. The Club shall be affiliated to the ACU, the fee for which shall be included in the annual subscription.
5. The Club shall be essentially a members' Club, and shall be conducted independently of any personal interests.
6. On notification of the Committee, the Club may organise from time to time coaching days and competitions open to members of this Club in Enduro, Cross Country, Trials, Motocross, Rally and Grass Track type events, and organise excursions and social events for Club members and their friends.
7. To arrange social events during the year.
8. The Club shall be governed by a Committee consisting of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and members; five to form a quorum. The Committee shall be elected for the year at the Annual General Meeting. In the case of a vacancy occurring on the Committee, the members shall immediately appoint another instead of the one vacating office.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall be held at Headquarters in the Lampeter Rugby Club. Fourteen days' notice to be given of a General Meeting; seven to form a quorum.
10. The Committee shall at the Annual General Meeting present a Report and Balance Sheet which latter shall be duly certified by two Auditors elected at the Annual General Meeting.
11. The Committee shall not make any modification in these Rules without the Authority of a General Meeting.
12. The role of the committee is to manage all aspects of the Club's administration. The committee shall not work autonomously. Planning activities, buying equipment and administering other Club matters must satisfy all members.
13. If any member desires a matter to be brought forward at a General Meeting, the text of such matter shall be sent to the Secretary at least 10 days before the date of such meeting, so that it may be included in the Agenda.
14. At General Meetings, whether ordinary or extraordinary, a majority of votes decides a resolution, the Chairman having a casting vote in case of even voting.
15. Members hold themselves bound in honour in all cases of dispute or disagreement as to the interpretation of the Rules and Regulations of the Club, to accept the decision of the Committee as final and binding.
16. The club is fully committed to the principles of the equality of opportunity.
17. No participant, volunteer, or member of the club will receive less favourable treatment on the grounds of gender, age, colour, disability, ethnic origin, parental or marital status, religious belief, social class or sexual preference than any other. The club will ensure that there is open access for all those who wish to participate in the activities of the club, in whatever capacity and that they are treated fairly. The club recognises its legal obligations not to discriminate and will regard discrimination by any participant, volunteer or member as grounds for disciplinary action under the relevant club rules.
